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Trials & Hearings

At the last hearing, confessed murderer, Chester Todd was offered a plea agreement on the charges of 2nd degree murder and sexual assault, in connection with the 1996 murder of Sherri Majors, which are being considered. In addition, the second competency hearing requested by the defense is underway at the Denver jail location. Sherri is the daughter of Linda and Everett Donelson. At the next hearing, scheduled for June 28 AM, it is expected that the plea offer and the competency test will be discussed.

At an earlier arraignment this year, defendant, Jeremy Torres, was charged with the 1st degree murder of James Sanchez, son of Pat and Tony Sanchez. a status hearing in this case is scheduled for May 31.

NATIONAL POMC NEWS & INFO

PAROLE BLOCK PROGRAM: To date 1394 convicted murderers have been denied parole through POMC's Parole Block Program! Parole Block was begun in 1990 and all members across the United States whose loved one's killer is up for early release/parole consideration can file a petition with National that is sent nationwide for signatures protesting their release.

TOPIC FORUM: POMC has a "Topic Forum" on its website. It provides a place where survivors all over the U.S. can communicate with each other. It is a good place for those who are unable to attend monthly grief support meetings to find support.

<u>SIBLING ONLINE SUPPORT</u>: Amanda Harris, a member of our Valley of the Sun Chapter in Phoenix who lost her brother Joshua, to murder, has formed an online Sibling Support venue <u>www.unitingsiblings.com</u>. This is a wonderful way to deal with sibling grief.

Those lives were mine to love and cherish, to guard and guide along life's way. Oh, God forbid that one should perish, that one alas should go astray.

Back in the years with all together, around the place we'd romp and play, So lovely now, I often wonder, oh, will they come back home some day?

I'm lonesome for my precious children, they live so far away, Oh, may they hear my calling and come back home some day.

I gave my all for my dear children, their problems still with love I share, I'd brave life's storms, defy the tempest, to bring them home from anywhere.

I lived my life, my love I gave them, to guide them through this world of strife. I hope and pray we'll live together in that great glad hereafter life.

Recently I attended the memorial service for the daughter of a very close friend of my son. Attending any memorial service for the death of a child touches the heart in a way that surpasses the usual "grieving" ritual. Not that any grieving process is "usual" by any means, but when the gathering is for a child, it tends to put an entirely different emphasis on the service. Quite naturally, for us, it brings back all the memories of our loss although the dynamics are rarely under the same circumstances, thank heaven! I wouldn't wish that on anyone. I do find however that through a loss like ours, we gain a great depth of compassion and perhaps can reach a family's heart in a way some can't. I hope that's not an unreasonable thing to say, but after having lost a son, I better understand the deep well of sadness in losing a child. It's just not the normal order of things; we never expect to bury a child.

At this memorial, a beautiful poem was read that I would like to share with you. Now I'm not an advocate for supposing that at an allotted time an angel comes to take our children home. God did not intend for our children to be murdered, we live in a fallen world, and I don't believe that at some designated time He decides time is up! Bad things happen to good people. But that doesn't mean that after death, heaven's gate doesn't open up to greet our children with open arms, with joy and song to welcome them into a place with no more pain and no more tears!

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Alas, there are many songs that suggest an angel came as does this song. So let's get beyond that angel piece and be joyful that our children are in a place of peace and love and that we are in each other's heart and that we will see them again. There are bits of the poem that just speak from your child to You!

If the sun should rise and find your eyes

All filled with tears for me;

I wish so much you wouldn't cry




